People v. Casey. 13PDJo46. July 24, 2013. Attorney Regulation. The Presiding Disciplinary Judge approved a conditional admission of misconduct submitted by the parties and suspended N. Franklyn Casey (Attorney Registration Number 18558) for two years and one day, effective July 24, 2013. The Supreme Court of Oklahoma suspended Casey for two years and one day upon finding that he violated several Oklahoma Rules of Professional Conduct, including Rules 1.5, 1.15(b) and (c), and 8.4(d). Casey's misconduct involved his participation in an improper declaratory judgment action and his filing of a frivolous application for approval of a settlement, which was calculated to enable him to misappropriate funds to which another law firm claimed an interest. The court found that this misconduct amounted to an intentional manipulation of the judicial system. Casey's misconduct constitutes grounds for the imposition of reciprocal discipline in Colorado pursuant to C.R.C.P. 251.21(e).
